We could still do with a few extra people, especially cake-bakers, so please get in touch if you fancy doing some baking for KiK. In other news, we are pleased to announce that we now have free Internet access for visitors coming into the café. Other things to look out for: The Reading Den ('Read With Me' session for children) dates to be published soon and KiK Squad Art Club will be starting on 11<sup>th</sup> February (3.15 - 4.15pm). On 7<sup>th</sup> February 10.30am - 12.30, we are hosting Community Health Checks (get a blood pressure check and find out about local services) and Men's Shed will be visiting as normal on 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2 – 4pm. The Community Pantry in St Mary's continues to provide for anyone in need of a bit of support with household supplies. The latest 6-month data shows that 442 items (136kg) were donated and 340 items (106kg) were distributed. Over the past few weeks we have been planting a new hedge around the allotments. You will see double lines of canes and tree guards to support and protect the new saplings. This will be a mixed hedge selected to attract and provide habitat for wildlife. Two rows have been planted to enable the hedge to be laid in future years. If the weather holds out, we hope to start to lay the hedge alongside the tarmac path before we have to stop to allow birds to nest undisturbed. The main messages, as always, are:- don't be afraid of using a defib...you can't harm the patient; and the defib will make all the main decisions for you.
